



A hedge can be any row of shrubs or trees used as a "living fence" to define a boundary, separate areas, protect from wind or sun or merely for privacy. A densely planted hedge can even act as a barrier against humans, dogs, and other larger animals. The plants listed below are all evergreen or semi-evergreen.

Keep in mind your privacy hedge doesn't need to be one wall of the same plant. It can be a mixture of many textures and shapes. Deciduous plants are also a great choice if you want light in winter and privacy in summer. Try mixing evergreens, deciduous trees and shrubs, fruit trees and flowers for a cottage garden look.

### SHORT 12-30 inches tall

*Andromeda polifolia*, Bog Rosemary (12-18 inches tall) Part to full sun. White to pink flowers, narrow leathery. Tolerates poor drainage.

*Azalea* (size dependent on variety) Sun exposure, height and flower color vary with variety.

*Berberis x stenophylla 'Corallina Compacta'*, Coral Barberry (18 inches tall) Full to part sun. Bright orange flowers and black fruit. Narrow needlelike foliage.

*Buxus sempervirens 'Suffuticosa'*, True Dwarf Boxwood (5 feet tall, un-pruned) Sun to shade. Small leaves and dense texture; classic hedge plant.

Vaccinium, Blueberries (2-8 feet tall)

Full to part sun. Best fruit production in full sun. Some varieties are semi to full evergreen.

#### MEDIUM 3-6 feet tall

*Abelia x grandiflora*, Glossy Abelia (2-8 feet tall) Full to part sun. Semi-evergreen foliage. Bronze new growth and White to pink flowers.

Aucuba japonica 'Rozannie' (3 feet tall)

Part to full shade. Glossy dark foliage; red berries.

Berberis darwinii, Darwin Barberry (5-8 feet tall)

Full to part sun. Bright orange flowers followed by black fruit. Dark green holly like leaves.

*Buxus sempervirens,* English Boxwood (15 feet tall, un-pruned) Sun to shade. Small leaves and dense texture; classic hedge plant.

*Choisya ternata 'Sundance'*, Gold Leaf Mexican Orange (3-6 feet tall) Sun to part shade. Glossy chartreuse to golden new foliage, very fragrant white flowers.

#### Distylium 'Vintage Jade' (2-3 feet tall)

Sun to part shade. Glossy dark foliage, small red flowers in winter. Mounding form.

Escallonia 'Newport Dwarf' (3-4 feet tall)

Sun to part shade. Glossy dark foliage, clusters of pink flowers.

Euonymus fortunei (4-5 feet tall)

Sun to shade. Deep green leaves edged in white or gold depending on variety.

### *llex glabra 'Shamrock'*, Inkberry (3-6 feet tall)

Sun to part shade. Thick dark green leaves and black berries; brighter new foliage.

*Kalmia,* Mountain Laurel (3-8 feet tall, depending on variety) Part shade. Glossy oval foliage. Showy pink, white, or red flowers are often pinwheel-marked.

*Mahonia aquifolium*, Oregon Grape (6 feet tall; shorter in full sun) Sun to shade. Glossy holly-like foliage. Spikes of yellow flowers followed by blue berries.

*Nandina domestica,* Heavenly Bamboo (2-8 feet tall, depending on variety) Sun to shade. Makes a light airy-looking screen or hedge.

*Osmanthus species* (4-10 feet, depending on variety) Sun to part shade. Glossy foliage, very fragrant flowers.

*Pieris japonica*, Lily of the Valley Shrub (3 feet tall) Part shade. Bronze to red new growth in spring. Showy sprays of white, pink, or red flowers.

## Pinus mugo, Mugo Pine (3-5 feet tall)

Full sun, well-drained soil. Slow growing.

*Rhaphiolepsis 'Southern Moon',* Southern Moon Yedda Hawthorn (5-6 feet tall) Sun to part shade. Glossy dark foliage, profusion of white flowers in spring.

# Rhododendron (4-6 feet tall, depending on variety)

Sun exposure, height and flower color varies with variety.

*Sarcococca, Sweet Box* (Slow growing to 4-6 feet tall) Partial shade to full shade. Glossy dark foliage; very fragrant white flowers in winter.

*Skimmia japonica* (Slow growing to 5 feet tall) Partial shade. Glossy oval foliage. Clusters of red/pink buds open to small white flowers.

*Taxus cuspidata 'Monloo'*, Emerald Spreader Japanese Yew (3 feet tall) Sun to part shade. Flat green needles. Very low-growing form.

*Vaccinium ovatum,* Evergreen Huckleberry (3-10 feet tall; shorter in full sun) Sun to shade. Glossy dark foliage; small bell-shaped white to pink flowers and black berries.

*Viburnum davidii,* David Viburnum (3-4 feet tall) Partial shade. Glossy dark green, deeply veined foliage. Clusters of metallic blue berries in fall.

# TALL: 6 feet tall and up

*Arbutus unedo,* Strawberry Tree (8-35 feet tall, depending on variety) Full sun. White flowers, red "strawberry-like" fruit; both on tree, nearly year-round.

*Aucuba japonica* (6-10 feet tall) Part to full shade. Glossy dark foliage; most varieties offered are variegated.

*Bamboo* (8-30 feet tall, depending on variety) Running bamboos need a barrier for containment; clumping/fountain bamboos will not.

*Camellia* (3-12 feet tall) Part shade, rich soil. Height, flower time, and flower colors vary with variety.

*Cephalotaxus harringtonia 'Fastigiata',* Columnar Japanese Plum Yew (To 8-10 feet tall) Full sun to part shade. Glossy dark needles.

*Choisya ternata,* Mexican Orange (6-8 feet tall) Sun to part shade. Glossy rich green foliage, very fragrant white flowers.

*Cotoneaster lacteus,* Parney's Cotoneaster (8-10 feet tall) Full to part sun. Leathery foliage. Clusters of white flowers. Red berries hold well in winter.

*Distylium 'Linebacker'* (8-10 feet tall) Sun to part shade. Glossy foliage, small red flowers in winter.

*Escallonia* (5-15 feet tall, depending on variety) Part to full sun. Glossy dark foliage, clusters of white or pink flowers.

*Ilex crenata,* Japanese Holly (6-12 feet tall) Sun to part shade. Foliage and form similar to boxwood but it tolerates colder winters.

*Ligustrum japonicum*, Wax-Leaf Privet (5-12 feet tall) Sun to part shade. Glossy oval foliage is dark green above, whitish underneath.

*Myrica californica,* California Wax Myrtle (10-15 feet tall) Full sun. Dense foliage is dark green above, pale underneath, pleasantly aromatic.

*Photinia x fraseri* (10-15 feet tall) Full sun. Glossy oval foliage; bronze-red new growth.

Prunus laurocerasus, English Laurel (10-30 feet tall)

*Prunus lusitanica,* Portuguese Laurel (10-30 feet tall) Full to part sun. Glossy dark green leaves, spikes of small but sweetly scented white flowers.

*Viburnum tinus*, Laurustinus (3-12 feet tall) Sun to part shade. Glossy dark foliage. White flowers in spring followed by blue berries. Chamaecyparis obtusa, Hinoki Cypress (6-30 feet tall)

Sun to filtered shade. Lacy foliage and nice structure. Golden and variegated forms available.

*Cupresso-cyparis leylandii,* Leyland Cypress (20-70 feet tall and wide) Full sun. Gray-green or gold foliage. Fastest growing plant for privacy.

*Cupressus sempervirens,* Italian Cypress (8-60 feet tall) Full sun. Dark green foliage; cultivars can be bluish, golden, or bright green.

*Taxus species,* Yew (6-50 feet tall) Sun to nearly full shade. Flat green needles and berrylike seeds (cones) on female plants.

*Thuja species*, Arborvitae, Western Red Cedar (10-15 feet tall) Full to part sun. Flat, scale like foliage of bright yellow green to dark lustrous green.

**Tsuga canadensis, Canadian Hemlock** (6-40 feet tall, depending on variety) Sun to partial shade. Dark green foliage; many varieties have striking new growth.
