



Magnolia List

DECIDUOUS MAGNOLIAS (*Magnolia* hybrids)

Ann Height 15-20 feet, width 10-15 feet. Rounded multi-trunk form. Purple to pink flowers in mid spring. Protect from harsh winter winds.

Ballerina (*M. x loebneri*) Height 10-12 feet. Fragrant starry flowers are white blushed pink

Black Tulip (*M. x soulangeana*) Height 15-20 feet, width 6-10 feet. Rounded tulip-shaped flowers are deep wine red.

Butterflies Height 20-25 feet, width 15-20 feet. 3-4" flowers in April—soft yellow and fragrant

Felix Jury Height 20-40 feet, width 10-15 feet. Very large fragrant hot pink flowers

Galaxy Height 12-20 feet, width 6-8 feet. Pyramidal shape. Likes full sun. Slightly fragrant "saucer" flowers; buds are dark red-purple, opening to rose-purple inside, lighter outside.

Genie (*M. x soulangeana*) Height 10-15 feet, width 6-8 feet. Fragrant tulip-shaped flower is deep wine red

Leonard Messel (*M. x loebneri*) Height 15-25 feet, width 6-10 feet. Rounded multi-trunk tree. Deep pink buds open to star-shaped lilac pink flowers. Protect from wind.

Merrill (*M. x loebneri*) Height 20-25 feet, width 20-25 feet. Rounded multi-trunk tree. Fragrant white starry flowers. Protect from harsh winds.

Sunsation Height 20-30 feet, width 8-10 feet. Narrow pyramidal form. Large tulip-shaped flowers are sunny yellow brushed with rosy purple at the base

Susan Height 6-8', width 4-7 feet; compact bushy form. Prolific magenta lily-shaped flowers

Yellow Bird Height 15-20 feet, width 10-12 feet. Yellow flower with tinge of green at the base. Blooms only 2-3 weeks.

STAR MAGNOLIAS (*Magnolia stellata*)

Centennial Height 8-10 feet; spread 6-8 feet. Arnold Arboretum selection with more petals, a hint of pink at the base of the white flowers.

Royal Star Height 10-20 feet, width 6-8 feet. Abundant large, fragrant, double white flowers

EVERGREEN MAGNOLIAS (*Magnolia grandiflora*) Fragrant, large white flowers in early summer, followed by showy seed pods. Evergreen foliage is shiny deep green on top, velvety brown underneath.

Bracken's Brown Beauty Height 35-50 feet; spread 15-25 feet. Pyramidal shape. Fragrant creamy white flowers. Dark green foliage with rusty underside.

D. D. Blanchard Height 40-50 feet, width 25-35 feet. Pyramidal shape. Lustrous dark leaves with rusty undersides. Fragrant, large, cup-shaped white flowers in summer.

Kay Parris Height 15-20 feet, width 8-10 feet. Long blooming variety. Dense compact habit. Shiny foliage; orange-brown underneath.

Little Gem Dwarf with compact narrow form. Height 10-15 feet, width 6-8 feet. Dark green foliage; chocolate on underside. Often re-blooms in late summer.

Teddy Bear Height 10-15 feet; spread 6-10 feet. Smaller foliage and flowers than most evergreen magnolias.

EVERGREEN MICHELIAS (*Michelia doltsopa* AKA *Magnolia doltsopa*) Evergreen Michelias are sometimes botanically classed as magnolias. They grow as upright, dense shrubs or can be pruned as small trees, usually getting 9-12 feet tall. The large, fragrant white flowers look like grandiflora flowers, except they are produced all up and down the branches, not just at the tips like other magnolias. Michelias are therefore literally covered in bloom in early summer.
