

PLANTING INSTRUCTIONS

Always start a new planting with a well-watered plant; roots will be more pliable and transplant shock will be reduced.

Dig your planting hole the depth of the root mass and 2-3 times the width. The plant should be planted at the same depth as it was in the pot; no deeper or higher. In dry months you may want to water the planting hole well and allow it to fully drain before planting to establish a moist environment for roots to flourish.

Shake off excess soil from roots to inspect them. Gently but firmly coax the roots out of the pot shape. Trim circling, girdling or kinked roots. Spread the roots out in all directions like a skirt. If the plant is excessively root-bound, you may make vertical cuts a short way into the sides of the roots and slice off the bottom-most roots. For balled and burlapped plants, it is easiest to leave the burlap on when checking planting depth then cut the ties and gently remove burlap. Remove plants from compostable pots before planting.

Backfill the planting hole with the original loosened soil. If you have poorly draining soil, it's better to amend the whole planting area rather than the planting hole. Amending just the planting hole risks creating a well of water around your plant roots. (If you have extremely poor soil and decide to go ahead and add compost to the planting hole, use a ratio of 1/3 compost to 2/3 original soil.) You can also add Dr. Earth Starter Fertilizer or E.B. Stone Sure Start to the soil to encourage root growth.

Add a few inches of mulch (wood chips, fertile mulch or leaf litter) to the ground around the plant keeping it away from the stem or trunk of the plant.

WATERING INSTRUCTIONS

Plants need consistent watering in the first three years of planting in order to establish good root growth. Water deeply, checking to make sure water is penetrating the soil around the roots. Allow the soil to dry out slightly in between watering. For the first few months after planting, check the soil to a depth of 4 inches every few days to ensure the soil is neither too soggy nor too dry.

You can build a soil berm around the edge of your planting area to create a basin to catch water and direct it to the new root zone

STAKING TREES & SHRUBS

If a tree needs staking, stake no more than two thirds the height of the tree. Drive the stakes outside the root mass area. Remove the stakes as soon as the tree is stable or after one year.

PLANT GUARANTEE
