



Sky Nursery is proud to offer a beautiful selection of excellent tomato varieties here at Sky. We've added a few varieties to our list this year, and others are back by popular demand. Our tomatoes are sustainably grown in Washington and Oregon. They are free from GMOs and synthetic pesticides.

### **HEIRLOOM, OPEN-POLLINATED, AND HYBRID VARIETIES**

Many of the varieties we offer are heirlooms: classics developed before about 1950. Heirlooms come in all shapes, sizes, and colors. All heirlooms are open-pollinated (non-hybrid). We also carry newer open-pollinated varieties. Seeds saved from these plants will grow up to be like their parents. Look for "heirloom" or "open pollinated" beneath variety names on this list.

We also carry hybrid varieties. Hybrids are crosses between two or more varieties and are known for vigor, high yields, and disease resistance. This makes them easier to grow and more reliable producers in cool summers. However, if you save seeds from a hybrid, you never know what's going to sprout.

Finally, we have heirloom crosses – hybrids with heirloom parents. The best of both worlds!

### **PLANT HABIT: INDETERMINATE AND DETERMINATE**

Indeterminate (Indet) tomatoes can grow to over 7' tall, can be pruned and trellised, and will produce over a long period. Determinate (Det) varieties grow to a given size and stop. They don't require trellises or cages, but they produce for a shorter amount of time. A few varieties are Semi-Determinate (Semi Det). These varieties are compact, but still produce over a longer period of time.

### **DAYS (TO HARVEST)**

The number of days listed under "DAYS" is an estimate of how long it will take for your tomato to produce fruit after it's transplanted into the ground. A smaller number means sooner and more reliable production, but some of the most flavorful varieties need longer to mature. All tomatoes prefer nighttime temperatures above 50°F. Plant outside in mid-May, or give them a head-start with a cold-frame, cloche, or greenhouse.

### **ORGANIZATION AND AVAILABILITY**

Sky organizes our tomatoes alphabetically within four categories: Cherry, Slicer, Sauce, and Beefsteak. Categories are subjective, but we've done our best to make them easy to navigate.

We expect to carry the following varieties regularly throughout the season. If your favorite is on this list but is not available when you look on the table, it will likely be back soon. Please give us a call Wednesday-Friday of the following week.

We will also bring in some tomato varieties that are not on this list, as interesting ones are sometimes offered in small quantities by our growers. Check out our "specialty" collections, and look for the orange "unique this week" signs.

## SUPER DWARF TOMATO VARIETIES

### THE DWARF TOMATO PROJECT

The Dwarf Tomato Project is a tomato breeding program run by tomato aficionados dedicated to producing tomatoes with heirloom flavor and good productivity but on compact plants. These varieties tend to run about half the size of comparable heirlooms and hybrids. All varieties are OpenSource Seed Initiative varieties, meaning the seeds can be saved or shared and are not allowed to be patented by a company. They are all hybrids produced by regular breeding. These varieties are great for containers but also perform well in the garden. Availability may vary depending on the growers!

### RECOMMENDED VARIETIES FOR BEGINNING GARDENERS

Every variety on this list was chosen because we would recommend it to at least some gardeners, but which varieties are right for you will depend on your goals and preferences. Here's a list of some varieties that we think taste great and produce reliably for most gardeners. If you're not sure where to start, start here.

#### BEEFSTEAK TYPES

**Big Beef** Reliable, flavorful variety with resistance to quite a few common tomato diseases

**Big Brandy** Excellent flavor and a long harvest on a compact plant. Great for small spaces.

**Siletz** Our earliest and most cold-tolerant variety that can still cover a burger in a single slice

#### SLICING TYPES

**Black Prince** A reliable and cold-tolerant heirloom with a beautiful, dusky color

**Bloody Butcher** Impressively tasty for such an early and productive variety

**Jaune Flamme** A reliable heirloom with beautiful orange color and fruity, rich flavor

**Moskvitch** Very early, delicious Russian heirloom that ripens in cool conditions

**Oregon Spring** Developed here in the PNW. Compact plant; ripens within a short window

**Stupice** Productive, adaptable, and cold-tolerant. Good, balanced flavor

**Taxi** Compact plant with sweet and non-acidic, bright yellow fruit.

#### CHERRY TYPES

**Black Cherry** Very productive and sweet, and also unique and beautiful. Will need support.

**Gold Nugget** Yellow compact cherry. Great for containers and small spaces.

**Oregon Cherry** Red compact cherry. Great for containers and small spaces.

**Sungold** Our most popular variety – look for it mid-week. Vigorous vines and great flavor. Will need support.

**Sunsugar** Very similar to 'Sungold,' but some prefer one or the other. Bred to resist cracking. Will need support.

**Sweet Million** Our most popular red cherry. Sweet, productive, and disease resistant. Will need support.

### TOMATOES GREAT FOR CONTAINERS

Any determinate tomatoes will do well in a patio container, but here are a few varieties we carry that are specifically recommended for small-space and container gardening.

**Big Brandy** (beefsteak) Large, flavorful, deeply lobed fruit on compact plants.

**Goliath Bush** (slicer) Classic round red fruit with sweet flavor.

**Oregon Cherry** (cherry) 1.5' plants perfect for a patio container garden, with classic 1" red fruit

Additionally, all of the **Super Dwarf** varieties do well in containers.
